PLAN TO PARTIALLY RE-OPEN COASTAL AND COMMUNITY PARKS IN CAMERON COUNTY

In an effort to determine the best and safest practices to reopen businesses and the economy of Cameron County, on April 20, 2020, Cameron County Judge Eddie Treviño, Jr. issued an Emergency Management Order Extending Mandatory Countywide Shelter in Place with Lifting of Certain Restrictions based upon guidance from state and local health authorities and the CDC.

Effective today April 24, 2020, the Plan to Partially Re-Open Coastal and Community Parks is ordered and shall commence on April 25, 2020 at 12:01 a.m. and will remain in effect until rescinded in writing by Cameron County Judge Eddie Treviño, Jr. The hours of operations and specific rules for the occupancy and use of each park, ramp, and access point may vary. All residents and visitors must read, adhere, and familiarize themselves with the Plan to Partially Re-Open Coastal and Community Parks Order and a failure to obey all Park Rules, County Orders and CDC guidelines will be grounds for the issuance of citations, removal from the park and other civil or criminal penalties. This order is issued with necessary precautions and provisions to protect the life, health and property of all residents of Cameron County.
