CAMERON COUNTY EMPLOYEES TEST POSITIVE FOR COVID-19

Today, July 24, 2020, the Office of Cameron County Judge Eddie Treviño, Jr., has been notified that three (3) employees from the Adult Probation Department, one (1) employee from the Constable Precinct 3 Office, one (1) employee from the Constable Precinct 5 Office, one (1) employee from the District Attorney's Office, two (2) employees from the District Clerk's Office, one (1) employee from the Human Resources Department, two (2) employees from Juvenile Probation Department, and forty-one (41) employees from the Sheriff's Office, and seven (7) employees from the Public Health Department have tested positive for COVID-19. Due to privacy laws, Cameron County will not release specific employee information.

The Public Health Department is working closely with elected officials and department heads to continue taking the appropriate steps to keep their employees and the public safe. "In the last several weeks, I have informed that area hospitals in Cameron County have exceeded capacity and are experiencing overwhelming hospitalizations. We all have the responsibility to do what's right for not only the protection of our own life but the lives of others. Please shelter-in-place and stay home and remember that the life you save may be your own," stated Cameron County Judge Eddie Treviño, Jr. "Further, to all County employees, please continue to protect yourselves and utilize health and sanitation protocols when out in public to prevent the spread of COVID-19 both at work and at home."
