**SECOND EXTENSION OF SECOND AMENDED EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT ORDER  
INCLUDING MANDATORY FACIAL COVERINGS, CURFEW, LIMITATIONS ON  
GATHERINGS, SHELTER-IN-PLACE, AND BEACH ACCESS CLOSURES WITH  
CLARIFICATIONS**

Effective immediately, Cameron County Judge Eddie Treviño, Jr., with the consent of the County Commissioners' Court has ordered the Second Extension of Second Amended Emergency Management Order Including Mandatory Facial Coverings, Curfew, Limitations on Gatherings, and Beach Access Closures with Clarifications issued and signed on June 29, 2020. As the transmission rate of COVID-19 is increasing significantly in Cameron County, this Clarification Order is issued as a continued emergency management measure to combat COVID-19.

In Cameron County, any business not in compliance with either the Governor's Orders or Local Orders may be subject to a fine not to exceed \$500 for each individual violation. If businesses are found to not be in compliance, applicable permit to operate may be revoked.

In addition to the recommendation to Shelter-in-Place, the established curfew issued in the June 29, 2020 Order and this extension is mandatory and any violators are subject to enforcement under the Texas Disaster Act of 1975 and the Cameron County Emergency Management Plan.

No more than ten individuals should gather in an area that does not provide for at least six feet between each individual, and outdoor gatherings are clarified to include organized fishing tournaments and similar recreational activities are excluded from the term/definition of recreational sports activities.

Furthermore, vehicle parking on the shoulder of Park Road 100/Ocean Blvd. north of Edwin King Atwood Park is prohibited and any owner/operator of the vehicle in violation of the provision will be subject to a fine not to exceed \$500.
