CAMERON COUNTY EMPLOYEES TEST POSITIVE FOR COVID-19

Today, July 10, 2020, the Office of Cameron County Judge Eddie Treviño, Jr., has been notified that one (1) employee from the Purchasing Department, one (1) employee from the Constable Precinct 1 Office, two (2) employees from the Justice of the Peace 1 Office, one (1) employee from the Justice of the Peace 4 Office, one (1) employee from the Public Works Precinct 3 Office, five (5) employees from the Juvenile Probation Department, one (1) employee from Pre-Trial Services, one (1) employee from the Auditor's Office, two (2) employees from the Tax Assessor Collector's Office, one (1) employee from the Adult Probation Department, one (1) employee from the International Bridge System, two (2) employees from the Parks System, ten (10) employees from the Sheriff's Office, four (4) employees from the Public Health Department, one (1) employee from the County Clerk's Office, and one (1) employee from the Vehicle Maintenance Department have tested positive for COVID-19. Due to privacy laws, Cameron County will not release specific employee information.

The Public Health Department is working closely with elected officials and department heads to continue taking the appropriate steps to keep their employees and the public safe.
