This raises the total number of COVID-19 cases to 3,246 in Cameron County. There have also been an additional fifty-six (56) individuals who have recovered, raising the total number of recovered individuals to 2,341.

Cameron County Public Health continues to work with the six nursing home facilities and one detention center in addressing the COVID-19 outbreaks. To date, the Cameron County cases arising from the Veranda Nursing Home has included 35 employees and 64 residents who have tested positive, including 11 who have passed away. The Rio at Fox Hollow in Brownsville has 35 employees and 36 residents who have tested positive, including 7 who passed away. Alta Vista in Brownsville has 1 employee and 4 residents who have tested positive. Harlingen Nursing and Rehabilitation Center currently has 4 employees and 2 residents who have tested positive. Ebony Lake Nursing and Rehabilitation has 1 employee and 4 residents who have tested positive. Brownsville Nursing and Rehabilitation Center currently has 2 employees and 1 resident who have tested positive. In addition, Port Isabel Service Processing Center has 11 employees and 75 detainees who have tested positive.

As part of the COVID-19 action response plan, Cameron County Public Health is conducting epidemiological investigations, contact tracing as needed, and continues to monitor the situation.
