Cameron County Public Health works closely with nursing home facilities to address COVID-19 cases and potential outbreaks. After 28 days without a new COVID-19 case from a respective nursing home, the facility is removed from the daily report. Cameron County Public Health will continue to work with the nursing homes and provide updates as needed.

As part of the COVID-19 action response plan, Cameron County Public Health is conducting epidemiological investigations, contact tracing as needed and continues to monitor the situation.

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
