**FOURTEENTH EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT ORDER INCLUDING
CAMERON COUNTY EMPLOYEE MASK MANDATE AND
REQUIREMENT FOR MEMEBERS OF THE PUBLIC DOING BUSINESS
IN COUNTY BUILDINGS AND FACILITIES TO WEAR MASKS**

In accordance with Governor Abbott's Orders up to and including GA-34, effective today March 9, 2021, Cameron County Judge Eddie Treviño, Jr. has signed and ordered the Fourteenth Emergency Management Order Including Cameron County Employee Mask Mandate and Requirement for Members of the Public Doing Business in County Buildings and Facilities to Wear Masks.

This Order continues the local disaster declaration and public health emergency for Cameron County and will be effective on Wednesday, March 10, 2021, at 12:01 a.m. and continue until Friday, May 7, 2021, at 12:01 p.m. unless extended, modified, or terminated early by the County Judge.

In Cameron County, all people 10 years or older should continue to utilize a facial covering when in a public place or working in areas that involve close proximity, every business establishment may operate at 100% capacity, all County employees must continue to utilize a facial covering at all times during working hours, and all members of the public doing business in Cameron County buildings and facilities must continue to utilize a facial covering while indoors.

As a reminder, stricter measures may be ordered should the Trauma Service Area V, which includes the Counties of Hidalgo, Willacy, Starr, and Cameron, COVID-19 patients as a percentage of total hospital capacity exceed 15% for seven consecutive days.
